Other parents and students have indicated feeling fearful of returning to in-person learning at this time, but wish to continue receiving an excellent SFA education. We have that option available as well.



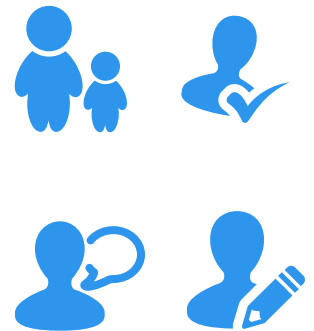
Student Expectations

- Students will have a mix of Google Meets for instruction and class discussions and learning activities that they will complete on their own time.
- Students are expected to be attentive and engaged in classroom lessons as if they were physically present in the classroom.
- Students will receive and return work virtually through a Learning Management System or platform (Google Classroom, Freshgrade)
- Students will participate in and be assessed on a full curriculum of core and specialty subjects, the same as those learning in-person.
- Students will participate in Mass and prayer opportunities virtually.
- A full uniform is not required, but student must wear an SFA uniform shirt and be properly groomed.



Parent Expectations

- Parents will track student assignments through Guardian emails sent via Google Classroom (3-8) or through FACTS (PK-2).
- Parents will provide support for directions, but NOT for answers to student work.
- Parents will oversee student digital activity through observation or the Parent Go Guardian app (provided).
- Parents will maintain regular communications with the student's teachers.
- Parents will promote and reinforce regular attendance and completion of school activities.
- Parents will promote and reinforce respectful posture and participation.
- Parents may move their child to SFA@SFA (in-person) learning at the beginning of a new month by informing the school **in writing** one week prior to a month's end.



Resources for Blended Learning - Both Programs

- Students in K-2 will be issued iPads
- Students in 3-8 will be issued Chromebooks
- Devices are available for Preschool as needed
- Adaptive software such as Raz Plus, Headsprout, Freckle, and Prodigy provide leveled reading and math learning
- Various on-line programming allows students to collaborate virtually or in person
- Various digital and print resources allow students to display their learning in multiple ways, allowing for better assessment.



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
